GRANTS UPDATE:

Lego Kits Grant - approved for LHS & WSS

Lego kits provide students in grades 3–5 with a hands-on opportunity to strengthen their creativity and problem-solving skills while learning the fundamentals of the build and design process. As students work through constructing models, they must imagine possibilities, experiment with different approaches, and adjust their designs when things don't fit together as planned. This fosters perseverance and critical thinking, encouraging them to see challenges as opportunities for innovation. The open-ended nature of Lego also allows students to design original creations, sparking imagination while reinforcing concepts such as balance, structure, and sequencing. Through these experiences, students gain not only a deeper understanding of how things are built, but also confidence in their ability to turn ideas into results.

o Science Journal Club Grant - approved for CSHHS

The Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory (CSHL) Science Journal Club offers high school students a rare opportunity to engage directly with cutting-edge research while building the academic and professional skills necessary for college, career, and civic success. Over the course of eight

sessions each semester, students are guided by CSHL scientists and educators to develop the ability to read, interpret, and critically analyze primary scientific literature. They practice presenting research clearly and confidently, engage in peer discussion and questioning, and learn to use advanced research databases such as PubMed and Web of Science.

The program integrates classroom learning with authentic laboratory experiences. Students visit three active research labs—chemistry, cancer biology, and neuroscience—where they observe experiments, interact with world-renowned scientists, and connect classroom concepts to real-world applications. Past participants report significant growth in their presentation skills, scientific literacy, and confidence in public speaking. Many note that the experience shaped their future career aspirations, sparking interest in neuroscience, genetic research, and biomedical sciences. The value of this program extends beyond the natural sciences. Students also practice social science skills such as evidence-based reasoning, communication, teamwork, and the ability to question and analyze information critically. The Journal Club mirrors the type of inquiry, collaboration, and discourse valued in social science disciplines, including sociology, psychology, and political science. By presenting research to peers, debating conclusions, and learning to support claims with data, students gain transferable skills that prepare them for civic engagement, informed decision-making, and leadership in a wide range of fields.

Each semester, 7-8 of our students can participate, for a maximum of 15 possible students annually.
