DISTRICT ITEMS

- 2022-2023 District Goals
 - 2022-2023 District Goals were presented at the October 18, 2022 Board of Ed meeting. To see the District Goals please refer to the District website.

PARENT ITEMS

- Bussing: students picked up at 7:30 am are on the bus for an extended period of time due to the 8:40 am unloading of busses at elementary schools.
 - Concerns should be addressed with Jean Luna, District Transportation Coordinator.
- Safety and security of the after-school sports programs. Coach should be waiting with students until a parent/guardian picks up.
 - Concerns should be addressed with the coach and brought to Mr. Bongino's attention, if necessary.
- Concerns were expressed about the social media outlets being used by the District (e.g., Twitter, Facebook). This is in response to the "window into the classroom" some parents requested.
 - Parents can choose to opt-out of pictures of their child being shared out on District social media.
 - For parents that do not have social media profiles and would like to access these pictures, you can access them through the District website.
- Concern regarding the Extra Help being offered by some teachers (e.g., not "reteaching the assignment").
 - Work through the CSH Communication Pathway (e.g., start with the teacher > curriculum directors/department chair > school principal).
- Study Skills sessions. A parent requested that these be embedded in the school day and earlier in the school year.
 - The plan is for these to be offered once a quarter.
- Request for Parent-Teacher conferences at the Junior High.
 - The administration continues to work through this concern.
 - Highly encourage parents to reach out to the teacher whenever there is a concern regarding a student.
- Turnover rate within the CSH Staff & Administration.
 - Mr. Huntsman is responsible for ensuring that all staff is supported and successful.
- Learning loss at the elementary level as a result of Covid. Can we bring some of these extra offerings to the 5th and 6th-grade students.
 - Administration will look into this.
