CSHHS PTG REPORT, SEPTEMBER 2023 Our first PTG meeting of the academic year occurred in mid-September, with over fifty parents in attendance. We are pleased to announce that our proposed amendments to our bylaws passed by a vote of 52 to 1. It is rare to find that kind of unity in either politics or schools, so we are grateful that a vast majority of PTG members agreed that our amendments would enhance school security and PTG self-governance.

Our next PTG meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 10th at 9:30 AM. We will have Mr. Monastero, our district's technology executive director, on hand to trouble-shoot any parent problems navigating the Canvas platform. Additionally, Dr. Suzanne Main, one of the high school's psychologists, will speak to us about monitoring and encouraging our children's academic progress without micro-managing.

We are providing a petting zoo for Homecoming on October 6th; parents with young children should come by between 5 and 7 PM, before the game, because the kids will have a chance to feed a variety of animals.

We are looking for volunteers for several events and functions: the Holiday Cookie Bake on December 20th; the Annual Literary Luncheon in early spring; the Staff Appreciation Luncheon on May. CULTURAL ARTS COMMITEE (CAC)

Domingo Zapata is a world renowned artist, writer, and fashion designer whose work is displayed throughout the world (including at the Louvre) and who was honored by the United Nations this month for his community outreach. He spoke to our students about following their dreams, whatever they may be, all while telling stories and creating original works of art based upon the students' input. These pieces will be displayed in the new STEAM wing and outside the Performing Arts Center at the high school. All AP art students (drawing, painting, graphic design, music, etc.) had an additional session creating individual paintings with Mr. Zapata, including the opportunity to have him participate in their individual artwork. Lloyd Harbor 5th & 6th graders will be exposed to the James Kennedy 90-second Newbery Film Festival in early October.

7th graders will experience Journeys into Native American Territory on September 28th & 29th.

High School Theater students will have the opportunity to see The Play That Goes Wrong on Broadway and participate in a student workshop on October 4th.
